• Associate Director of Food and Nutrition **Jake Letourneau**, Human Resources Director **Deb Perna** and Coordinator of Staff Development **Rosemary Jonientz** worked incredibly hard to develop MCH's Leadership Development Program, which graduated its first class in February. The program is a four week course offered quarterly, which is broken into four sessions: Leadership of Self, Leadership of Business, Leadership of Others, and Mindset of a Leader. The course is highly interactive, pairing open dialogue with break-out group activities and meaningful handouts to build your "leadership toolkit." The next class starts in March of 2023.
