Volunteering By The Numbers

1 new volunteer joined our program—Welcome to Jean A who will be working in the Thrift Shop!

Our data shows that **59** volunteers were active in January, contributing **766** hours to MCH—but due to computer issues, we do not have all hours counted yet!

50% of January Transport Shifts were filled, but this number may also increase!

59% of the Friendly Visitor requests were filled, meaning **68** residents have a volunteer assigned, and **47** residents are still waiting.

Did you know?

The Dutch Connection at the George Eastman Museum is a display of tulips, daffodils and other flowering plants that takes place Feb 6—22. This annual event was inspired by Eastman: between 1905—1932, he would order tens of thousands of bulbs from Holland for his garden and for indoor forcing (tricking bulbs to bloom out of season). This beautiful exhibit reminds us that Spring is on the way!
